Don Lowry has led the transformation of EPCOR Utilities Inc. into a national power and water company. Under his direction, EPCOR has responded to the unparalleled opportunities and challenges created by the restructuring of energy markets. Under Don's leadership, the company doubled its earnings and assets in the past few years.

EPCOR co-owns, operates and was the builder of Canada's most technologically advanced coal-fired power plant – Genesee 3 in Alberta, recognized worldwide for efficiency and environmental performance. The company's Kingsbridge I and II wind power projects in Ontario will be more than double the size of Canada's largest existing wind farm.

In 2005, a platform for EPCOR's future growth was secured with the \$529 million acquisition of a substantial interest in one of North America's premier power trusts. Today, the EPCOR Power L.P. has 11 plants across Canada and the United States and a market capitalization of \$1.6 billion.

EPCOR water operations serve more than one million customers in 50 Western Canadian communities. EPCOR recently partnered with the B.C. Government to build a water treatment facility to clean-up Britannia Mine – on the Sea to Sky Highway – one of North America's largest sources of heavy metal pollution.

Before joining EPCOR, Don spent more than 20 years in the telecommunications industry, helping to shape its evolution through key leadership roles. He was President and Chief Operating Officer of Telus Communications Inc. and Chairman of Alta Telecom. He has extensive experience in regulated and unregulated energy markets as well as in restructuring, regulatory matters, labour negotiations, start-ups, joint ventures and international business development.

Don graduated from the University of Manitoba in 1973 with a B.Comm. Hons, followed by an MBA degree in 1976. He is a graduate of the Harvard Advanced Management Program and the Banff School of Management.

Don is active in the community and serves on several Boards, including Hydrogenics Corporation, the Canadian Electrical Association, Alberta Climate Change Central, Alberta Economic Development Authority and The Banff Centre. He is Chairman of the EPCOR Power L.P. Board of Directors.
